#### Yuletide review

This first ATB Christmas was an extremely special period in the bands history, and will be remembered for a very long time! ATB musicians played at a variety of events including Christmas Fayres, supermarkets, care homes, private birthday parties, formal concerts and town appearances. The generosity of the Andover public and businesses was guite overwhelming and substantial amounts were raised for band funds.



The most memorable day perhaps was Saturday 18th December 2010. Overnight Andover had experienced the heaviest snowfall for decades. The roads were impassable, yet the dedication and enthusiasm of ATB personnel resulted in a near full band struggling through the snow to play at the Time Ring in the High Street, to the obvious delight of the Andover shoppers. The evening concert at John Hanson School was in serious doubt, but the hardy souls that attended were treated to the bands first-ever full concert, featuring a beginners group, youth and community bands. The playing was superb; the younger children performed a fantastic nativity and even Father Christmas made it through the snow to present the band with a magnificent new baritone!



#### Music for all

ATB prides itself on providing a musical opportunity for anybody who wishes to play a brass instrument. We cater for children through to adults and from raw beginners through to the most advanced players. There is room for all at ATB! Lesley Wallace has taken on the role of ATB Development Officer, and oversees a well defined structure:

- A Contest Band has been established for the more advanced player who is looking for an extra challenge. Steve also conducts this band, and has a proven track record of success at regional and national competitions.
